Thank you for the responses to our communication survey. There were 50 responses and some very useful comments.

- -92% of parents always read the newsletter.

- -92% of parents use Facebook, 86% use School Spider, 80% use Scopay, 44% use the website, 18% use Twitter. There were lots of positive comments regarding the school's communication- thank you for those! Lots of parents felt the balance was just about right and like the fact we communicate in different ways. There were positive comments about how concise, but informative the newsletter is. Lots of parents also like the information in homework diaries and feel this is an improvement this year.

Supporting your child at home with Mathematics

During parents evening some parents requested some ideas to support their children with maths. As a parent, it

sometimes can be tricky to support your child if you don't recognise the methods they are using.

We would encourage parents to firstly look at our calculation policy online which explains the stages children go through in each area of calculation: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

As children move through each stage they will begin working with concrete objects, e.g. counters, pennies, cubes and gradually work towards more abstract concepts (see examples).
