Attendance and Holidays in Term Time - new guidance

There are new government expectations for attendance and holidays in term time that have been launched this September. This was discussed in more detail at the 'Meet the Teacher' meeting on Wednesday but here is a brief summary of what was covered. For further details, please visit gov.uk/school-attendance-absence.

Starting from September 2024, schools must **strictly limit** holiday requests during term time, with exceptions only for serious emergencies/circumstances. Parents should be aware that fines of £80, rising to £160 if unpaid within 21 days, may be issued for unauthorised absences, with a maximum of two fines per child, per parent, over a three-year period. A second fine within three years will be £160, with any further absences leading to court action. Requests for leave must be supported by detailed documentation; otherwise, absences will be deemed unauthorised, increasing the risk of fines and legal consequences. The new rules underscore the importance of continuous learning, and parents are encouraged to plan holidays during school breaks to avoid impacting their child's academic progress.

A reminder of the School Uniform Policy

Following our "Meet the Teacher" event on Wednesday, I wanted to briefly revisit our Behaviour for Learning focus for this year, which includes our school uniform policy. We're paying special attention to making sure everyone adheres to our uniform expectations, as even small deviations can lead to a more relaxed attitude towards the policy.

Over the past few years, we've noticed some children starting to wear inappropriate footwear, unsuitable PE clothing, and a significant increase in smart watches and jewellery. Our uniform policy is in place to ensure safety, minimise fashion trends, and maintain clear expectations for learning. When the policy isn't followed, it can make a negative impact on the overall learning environment of the school.

Please therefore take a moment to review our <u>uniform policy</u> with your child and ensure they are dressed appropriately for school each day. By working together, we can create a positive and focused learning environment for everyone. Thank you for in advance for your support with this!

Primary and Secondary Admission Applications Open

Applications are now open for children starting primary school and transitioning to secondary school. Parents are strongly advised to apply for three preferences.

Applications must be submitted to the child's home local authority by:

- 31 October 2024 for pupils moving up to High School in September 2025.
- 15 January 2025 for pupils starting primary in September 2025.

Parents still need to apply even if the child has a brother or sister already at the school or the child is attending a nursery/preschool attached to the school.
